FLYING START CHALLENGE

Two Year 8 teams got through the initial testing stage and qualified for the regional finals, which were held at the University of the West of England's Engineering Faculty. On the day the students had to fly their gliders, take part in two engineering challenges and stand in front of the other schools and a judging panel of aeronautical engineers from Airbus, Safrane, Rolls Royce and Atkins to present their designs.



Both teams did extremely well in the presentation, explaining costings, manufacture and flight dynamics, backed up by two wonderful AO posters. The day's challenges were very taxing and showed off the skills of our students: one team made their glider fly further than any other school, gaining maximum points.

Well done to 'Gordano Gliders' and 'Air Killers', plus all the other Year 8 students who worked extremely hard to help both teams do so well. Overall 'Gordano Gliders' came second and have an instant invitation to the grand final to be held later this year. A huge thanks to Mr Earle from the DT Faculty for preparing and supporting the students so well over many weeks in the lead-up to the competition.
