Building 'Performance' Bridges

Essential task

Please be prepared to give a performance in the first few weeks of Year 12. This will just be to your teacher/class. Ideally the piece will be Grade 5 or higher and it CANNOT be a piece which you used for GCSE.

The ideal scenario is that you are able to perform at Grade 7 or 8 by the March of your Year 13. If you are not at that level yet, you need to have this target clearly in your mind from now on. If you are currently grade 4 for example, you will need to step up your practice routine to ensure that you make rapid progress over the coming summer, and throughout Year 12.

Building 'Composing' Bridges

Optional Task

It is hard to set an extended composition project to help you develop this ability during the break but you would be well served by creating an arrangement of something. The ideal scenario is that it would be for an ensemble that we have in school. We are always looking for good, modern arrangements for our smaller outfits; saxophone quintet, string quartet, woodwind ensemble, barbershop, barbieshop etc... You could choose a piece of music (one that you already have the music for) and create an arrangement for it using Sibelius or Noteflight (available online) software.

For example, if you are a clarinetist, you could use the piano part and lead part of a piece from your graded book to create a 4 part version of the piece for a woodwind quartet. The skill here is sharing the melody out and creating interesting textures rather than worrying about what is the correct note.
