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Screen-Break Day, Wednesday 3rd February

Many thanks for all the positive feedback regarding the Screen-Break Day on Wednesday. It has been lovely for us to hear of the range of wider educational activities that students engaged in. One lovely example has been the sharing, on social media, of some of the recipients of 'acts of kindness' from Gordano Students, such as finding chocolate bars and bunches of daffodils in random places around Portishead, with little notes explaining that they were part of the 'kindness challenge' from Wednesday's menu of activities. What better illustration of positive community action to lighten these tough times?

Review of Remote Learning

We are delighted that over 1,200 students have responded to our Student Survey on Remote Learning in Term 3. You can see a summary of some of the responses at the bottom of this letter to give you a flavour of their feedback. We are also very grateful to members of the Parent Forum, who met last week to give some really useful feedback from a parent perspective, and we have also been gaining feedback from school staff this week.

It is clear that, despite remote provision generally going really well (and with continued thanks for all the positive feedback that you're sharing), 'remote learning fatigue' has been a growing challenge for all of us! We know that much of this is out of our control (teaching through a screen is definitely not what we came into teaching for!). Nonetheless, we have been considering carefully how we might 'tweak' the experience for students going into Term 4, where we know we have at least two more weeks of remote learning. This will not be a significant change to the structure from Term 3, but we do think that there are a few minor changes that will, overall, benefit students and staff, and we will share the detail of this next week.
