Covid Update

I know that we'll all be concerned about the new variant that has been discovered and the impact that this could have on Covid measures and, potentially, schools. It's really early days, so we will watch this very carefully.

In the meantime our Covid rates in school continue to reduce; they are now at the same rate as we were seeing in September (about 0.6% of the school population). It is likely that we are now starting to see the impact of vaccinations kick in, but we remain cautious and want to ensure that we safeguard students' education and the wider opportunities that offer, so will be maintaining the wearing of face coverings indoors for the foreseeable future.

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Social Media Use

We do not have any involvement in these groups being set up and would not support the setting up of these groups given the age restrictions that many are breaching by having certain social media accounts (please see guidance in the links below).

A number parents have expressed concerns regarding the language and behaviour of some students on these platforms. Whilst we share concerns around the nature of some communications on social media, we are simply unable to 'police' all social media behaviour.

We will always advise and support where we can, and there may be instances where it is appropriate to become involved (for example, where it relates more specifically to school matters), but in general, it must be the responsibility of the parent/carer to monitor social media use and to address any issues or concerns. Please ensure that you are monitoring your child's social media use in supporting them to learn how to conduct themselves online. It's going to be a very important life-long skill for them!

Should parents be concerned that any language and behaviour could be considered against the law then it should be reported to the police.
