






Year 7 Homework

- Homework at Gordano may look very different from primary school!
- Homework will be set every two weeks on Tuesdays of Week 1.



- Homework will not be set straightaway for Year 7
- Subject deadlines will vary over the fortnight (no less than 7 days to complete)
- Homework task should normally take **30-40 minutes** to complete
- Homework support for 2+ missed homework tasks: Wednesday after school





























Reading is a Gateway to Success

- A more important **indicator of success** than the educational status of parents
- Helps brain development and has a positive impact across all subjects
- The strongest factor affecting pupils' science scores is reading comprehension
- Reading improves teenagers' vocabulary by 26%



Just 20 minutes a day ...

Why read for 20 minutes a day?		
Pupil a reads	Pupil B reads	pupil c reads
20 minutes a day	5 minutes a day	l minute a day
3,600 MINUTES PER SCHOOL SEAR	900 MINUTES PER SCHOOL	180 MINUTES PER SCHOOL YEAR
1,800,000 words per year	282,000 words per year	8,000 words per year
Scores in the 90 th percentile on tests	Scores in the 50 th percentile on tests	Scores in the 10 th percentile on tests

If a pupil begins reading when they are in reception, by the end of Year 6, pupil A will have read for the equivalent of 60 school days, pupil B will have read for 12 school days, and pupil C will have read for 3.



School Email

Microsoft Outlook is the name of the school email service. You will use this account to log in to other school services.





Class Charts

Download the Class Charts Student app for iPhone or Android.

To log in, use the Class Charts Code on your sticker. You may be asked for your date of birth.



Your code will only work for the first few weeks in September, contact the mailbox if you need a new code.



Educake (Science)



Click here for Science's Educake platform. To log in, click on the button that reads "Sign in with Microsoft".



After clicking the button, you may be asked to select your school email account. Otherwise, enter your school email account details.

You should now be logged in and able to use the platform.

Sparx Maths

Click here for the Sparx Maths website. You'll be prompted to type the name of our school - "Gordano School".

Click the blue button that reads "Log in to Sparx using Microsoft".



Just like Educake, you'll be asked to select your school email account. You may be asked for your date of birth. Afterwards, you'll be able to use the platform.

Why do we launch the year with an assembly on expectations?

- It acts as a foundation for a successful and productive year ahead

Attendance and Punctuality

- Students should be on site by 8.35am and at tutor bases ready for 8.40am
- Students should aim for attendance of 96% and above
- Good attendance and punctuality lead to stronger academic progress, disruptionfree learning for all and build a strong foundation for life beyond school
- We ask for daily contact through Microsoft Forms (link on website) if your child is absent
- We ask parents to work with the school where there are issues with attendance
- From 1st September 2024 we have adopted the LSP attendance policy (this can be found on our website)
- Term-time holiday can be approved only in extremely exceptional circumstances

expectations but you are not disrupting the learning of others you will stay in the classroom but be issued with

an after-school detention.

Blazers – To be worn all the time

Grey school jumpers – can be worn underneath, but not instead of a blazer

Trousers can be fitted, but must not be tight fitting around the lower leg (please see photos below for guidance).

Shoes must be black and polishable. Cloth material footwear / black trainers are not permitted.

Skirts/Shorts must sit just above the knee. It is not permitted to roll up skirts or shorts. If wearing school uniform shorts/skirts, socks/tights must be grey or black.

Shirts must be tucked in at all times

Coats - should be OFF in lessons















We are a proudly phone-free school

In June 2025, we became a phone-free school, using Yondr pouches to ensure this, to great success

If students choose to bring a phone to school, it is locked in a pouch each morning and unlocked at the end of the day, when they leave. They are responsible for bringing their pouch each day, storing it in their bags locked.

Your children have taken to the system like ducks to water!

Pouch Forgotten	-1 behaviour point; phone kept in the Student Centre for the day and a 10 minute detenion at the end of the day.
Student found with phone out of pouch	-3 behaviour points and a day's internal suspension
Student who does not bring a phone to school	Please put a signed note in their pouch confirming that they do not bring a phone to school.







Free School Meals


Qualifying benefits for Free School Meals

- Your child will be entitled to free school meals if you get any of these benefits:
- income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA)
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- **Child Tax Credit** (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on, paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- **Universal Credit** with annual take home pay/met earnings below £7,400 (which equals £616.67 per month) benefits not included



How to Apply

Google Search: Free School Meals North Somerset





- Scroll down the page and click the blue button
- Answer the questions
- Immediate response
- If eligible, send the reference code to the school parent mailbox address
- It will take 2 working days for Aspens canteen account to be activated
 - If your child stays in the same school, you don't need to do anything at this time. Your free school meals will continue until the end of Year 6 for Primary Schools and the end of Year 11 for Secondary Schools. Please do not reapply as you may lose your entitlement.
 If your child moves from primary to secondary school in North Somerset in September 2024, you don't need to do anything. Your free school meals will continue and we will update the new school please do not reapply as you may lose your entitlement. The exception is if your child moves from a non-North Somerset school to a North Somerset school, then you will need to apply on our free school meals system so we can transfer your eligibility.
 - If your child moves school during the school year, please email us and we will update your free school meals record for you – please do not reapply as you may lose your entitlement.

Children do not receive free school meals in college.

If your child has free school meals at a school outside of North Somerset and they are changing to a North Somerset school, you will need to reapply on our system so we can transfer your eligibility.

We will update this page in January 2025 to give further details on the government changes to free school meals that are due in April 2025.
