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Remote learning and parental 'check ins'

We have been delighted to hear that the arrangements for remote learning largely seem to be going really well. Student 'attendance' is very high (as we'd hoped) and we're really pleased with the way that students are engaging with their teachers and with their learning.

It is important that students complete their work to the best of their ability by the 'due date' set on Firefly. In most cases this should be during the lesson time, but may sometimes require a little extra time over the next day or so. This is why the due date will usually be set on a date after the lesson itself.

Please keep an eye on Class Charts to see merits awarded and any incomplete work notifications. Where there are any concerns arising from the completion of work or engagement in lessons, staff will make contact with parents to discuss why a student may be struggling.

Staff will also be making calls to all families to 'check in' from time to time with how remote learning is going. The member of staff will be able to pass on any issues to the relevant people, to get back to you if they are unable to help themselves. Please note that staff may be making these calls from home, if so the call would likely come up as 'withheld number' on your phone.

Access to devices and internet

During the lockdown period, we want to be able to support any family whose child does not have access to a laptop or appropriate device at home, so that every Gordano student is able join the remote learning lessons on Teams. At the start of term, we made a successful application for some more laptops from the Department for Education. As yet these laptops have not arrived, but we hope to receive them very soon and will be in touch with those families who have requested support as soon as we can.
