Dear Parents and Carers

I would like to start this final letter of the year by thanking you as parents for your continued support towards the school since the start of September. Uniform

Thank you for your continued support with uniform. A reminder that students need to wear their blazer and not their Gordano Hoodie with formal uniform. Any student not in the correct uniform will be expected to follow our uniform correction process. Please can you ensure that your child is wearing their blazer with their formal uniform from January. Students wearing the incorrect uniform will be given an A1 and any student who refuses to follow our uniform correction process will be given an A2.

Year 9 Baseline Assessments

The Year 9s will be completing a MidYis assessment during an English lesson during December or January. This one-hour assessment acts as a data set to replaces the Key Stage 2 SATs which were not sat during Covid in 2021. This information supports teaching staff with Target Grades so students and staff will begin to discuss these over coming months. The first formal feedback of Target Grades and Projected Grades will be reported home in the Achievement Review 2 in May.
