
Year 9 Homework

- Homework will be set every two weeks on Tuesdays of Week 2.




- Subject deadlines will vary over the fortnight (no less than 7 days to complete)

Why do we launch the year with an assembly on expectations?

- It acts as a foundation for a successful and productive year ahead
- It sets a clear tone and understanding of behavioural, academic and cultural expectations for students and all members of the community
- It provides an opportunity to align everyone's understanding of the values, goals and standards of our school community
- It allows us to provide a positive and cohesive environment from the very start



 High expectations of behaviour are crucial because they create a positive and structured learning environment that benefits both individuals and the community as a whole

 This year, Kindness, Resilience and Teamwork will sit at the heart of everything we do



Attendance and Punctuality

- Students should be on site by 8.35am and at tutor bases ready for 8.40am
- Students should aim for attendance of 96% and above
- Good attendance and punctuality lead to stronger academic progress, disruption-free learning for all and build a strong foundation for life beyond school
- We ask for daily contact through Microsoft Forms (link on website) if a child is absent
- We ask parents to work with the school where there are issues with attendance
- From 1st September 2024 we have adopted the LSP attendance policy (this can be found on our website)
- Term-time holiday can be approved only in extremely exceptional circumstances

If you disrupt the learning again you will be asked to leave the room and take your work (If possible) to the Focus room_for the remainder of that lesson.

If you are not meeting the behaviour for learning

expectations but you are not disrupting the learning of others you will stay in the classroom but be issued with

an after-school detention.

Uniform – thank you!

Blazers – To be worn all the time

Grey school jumpers – can be worn underneath, but not instead of a blazer

Trousers can be fitted, but must not be tight fitting around the lower leg (please see photos below for guidance).

Shoes must be black and polishable. Cloth material footwear / black trainers are not permitted.

Skirts/Shorts must sit just above the knee. It is not permitted to roll up skirts or shorts. If wearing school uniform shorts/skirts, socks/tights must be grey or black.

Shirts must be tucked in at all times

Coats - should be OFF in lessons















We are a proudly phone-free school

In June 2025, we became a phone-free school, using Yondr pouches to ensure this, to great success

If students choose to bring a phone to school, it is locked in a pouch each morning and unlocked at the end of the day, when they leave. They are responsible for bringing their pouch each day, storing it in their bags locked.

Your children have taken to the system like ducks to water!

Pouch Forgotten	-1 behaviour point; phone kept in the Student Centre for the day and a 10 minute detenion at the end of the day.
Student found with phone out of pouch	-3 behaviour points and a day's internal suspension
Student who does not bring a phone to school	Please put a signed note in their pouch confirming that they do not bring a phone to school.

Free School Meals

Qualifying benefits for Free School Meals


Your child will be entitled to free school meals if you get any of these benefits:

- income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA)
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- **Child Tax Credit** (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on, paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit with annual take home pay/met earnings below £7,400 (which equals £616.67 per month) - benefits not included

- Scroll down the page and click the blue button
- Answer the questions
- Immediate response
- If eligible, send the reference code to the school parent mailbox address
- It will take 2 working days for Aspens canteen account to be activated

- If your child stays in the same school, you don't need to do anything at this time. Your free school meals will continue until the end of Year 6 for Primary Schools and the end of Year 11 for Secondary Schools. Please do not reapply as you may lose your entitlement.
- If your child moves from primary to secondary school in North Somerset in September 2024, you don't need to do anything. Your free school meals will continue and we will update the new school – please do not reapply as you may lose your entitlement. The exception is if your child moves from a non-North Somerset school to a North Somerset school, then you will need to apply on our free school meals system so we can transfer your eligibility.
- If your child moves school during the school year, please email us and we will update your free school meals record for you please do not reapply as you may lose your entitlement.

Children do not receive free school meals in college.

If your child has free school meals at a school outside of North Somerset and they are changing to a North Somerset school, you will need to reapply on our system so we can transfer your eligibility.

We will update this page in January 2025 to give further details on the government changes to free school meals that are due in April 2025.
