School Uniform Next Week

Year 10 Mock Exams (19th – 30th June)

Starting on **Monday 19th June**, the Year 10s have mock exams for the next fortnight. This will also include Year 9 students who are taking Religious Studies. The logistics have been shared by **Mr Beesley** via **ClassCharts**. Students need to ensure that they are on time at the start of the school day and register with their tutor as normal, then go to their exam venues. In the afternoon, students should go straight to their exam venues and will be registered there.
