Christmas Lunch

The **Sixth Form** will be having their **Christmas lunch** in the dining hall on **Tuesday 13th December**. This will mean that students in **years 7-11** will only be able to access grab and go food from the canteen. On this day we will be staggering year groups for lunch collection in the canteen. **Students in years 7 and 10** will leave for lunch at **12.45pm** all other year groups will come down to lunch at **12.55pm**.

Wednesday 14th December, the dining hall will only be open to those students who have booked a Christmas lunch. Therefore, students who have not booked a Christmas lunch will need to go to the canteen for lunch on this day. On this day we will be staggering year groups for lunch collection in the canteen. Students in years 7 and 10 will leave for lunch at 12.45pm all other year groups will come down to lunch at 12.55pm.

Uniform/PE kit

We recognise that temperatures have decreased dramatically in the past week. In response to this we will permit students to wear their Gordano Hoodie/School Jumper (grey) if they would like to on non-PE days instead of their Blazer. We will review this at the end of January, however if students are wearing a hoodie or jumper that is not Gordano branded, they will be expected to remove the item/s and replace them with a Gordano Hoodie/School Jumper. Students must not be wearing coats in classrooms unless the teacher has permitted this, any refusal to follow this expectation will result in the behaviour policy being applied. We are also seeing an increase in black leggings, please ensure that your child is wearing navy leggings only on PE days. Please can you speak with your child about these changes and expectations and thank you as always for your continued support in upholding our uniform standards.

They are through to the regional stages of the EFL tournament which means they are 2 victories away from a trip to Wembley. In the ESFA National Cup, the girls have swept aside Millfield in Round 1, Oasis Brightstowe in Round 2, Worle in Round 3 and Exmouth Community College in Round 4. For most students taking part it was their first time playing in a chess tournament.
