Dear Parents and Carers,

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Changes to Covid isolation guidelines for students

On Friday the Department for Education changed (at very late notice) the guidance regarding isolation for school students, in line with a range of other changes (including the end of 'free' Covid test kits for most people, including schools).

The new guidance is as follows:

- Children with symptoms of respiratory infection (likely to be a persistent cough or sore throat), who have a high temperature or feel unwell, should not go to school and should avoid contact with other people until they feel well enough to go back to school / work and no longer have a high temperature. This is pretty much as with any 'usual' illness.
- Students with a positive Covid test result should not come to school (and should avoid contact with others) for 3 days after which they can return to school as soon as they are feeling well enough. The day of the test result counts as 'Day 0'; they can then return to school on 'Day 4'.
- Students do <u>not</u> need to have two negative lateral flow tests before they return.

Covid vaccinations for 5-11 years olds

For parents of those in Year 7 who have not yet had a Covid vaccination as they are not yet 12, Covid vaccinations are now available for children aged 5 - 11. This can be booked via the national booking system (below), through your GP or at a range of walk-in centres.

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Day for Ukraine and Sixth Form RAG Fair, Wednesday 6th April
