## YEAR 11 - MOCK EXAM & EXAM

Students experience near full control of their creative choices for the first time in the mock exam. A checklist is provided with a time frame, along with a lengthy body of resources and stimuli to get them going. The content of the checklist is all tasks covered numerous times in years 7-10, so there is a strong sense of familiarity. Students can choose their title, the artists from which they draw inspiration and the media in which they respond. Teaching tends to become more 1-2-1 and in small groups as students progress at such different speeds. The goal of the mock exam is to empower students, test their independence and train them to manage their time effectively to completing a final piece.
